The crucial step of reaching out to the worst affected and most deserving beneficiaries was only made possible with the help of our large network of educational institutes across the country.

Alhamdulillah, our media team performed well in assuring the transparency of our organization to the donor community and captured and presented every step of the relief activities to the public.
