


the other day was faced with an unanticipated downpour that drenched him entirely.

Learn about air resistance while making an awesome parachute! Design one that can fall slowly to the ground before putting it to the test, making modi-What you'll need:

- A plastic bag or light material
- String
- A small object to act as the weight.

Instructions:

- Cut out a large square from your plastic bag or material.
- Trim the edges so it looks like an octagon (an eight-sided shape). • Cut a small whole near the edge of each side.

- Attach 8 pieces of string of the same length to each of the holes. • Tie the pieces of string to the object you are using as a weight.
- Use a chair or find a high spot to drop your parachute and test how well it worked, remember that you want it to drop as slow as possible.

What's happening?

Hopefully your parachute will descend slowly to the ground, giving your weight a comfortable landing. When you release the parachute the weight pulls down on the strings and opens up a large surface area of material that uses air resistance to slow it down. The larger the surface area the more air resistance and the slower the parachute will drop.

Cutting a small hole in the middle of the parachute will allow air to slowly pass through it rather than spilling out over one side, this should help the parachute fall straighter.

Run-On Senfences

A run-on sentence is a sentence with at least two independent clauses (complete thoughts) which are forced together instead of being properly connected.

To correct these sentences, you have several options:

- 1) Separate clauses using punctuation.
- 2) Separate clauses using a conjunction.
- 3) Rearrange the sentence (you may add or remove words).

Run-on sentence: He put on some sunscreen, the sun was so extremely hot, and he wanted to go inside.

"He put on some sunscreen"→ 1st clause

"the sun was so extremely hot"→ 2nd clause

"he wanted to go inside"→ 3rd clause

Corrected sentence: He put on some sunscreen because the sun was extremely hot. He wanted to go inside.


In the corrected sentence, we separated the 1st and 2nd clauses using the conjunction "because", and we removed the word "so". We also separated the 2nd and 3rd clauses using a period.

Note: Just because a sentence is long does not necessarily mean it is a run-on. Some long sentences are grammatically correct, while some short sentences are run-ons.

Note: Simple, short sentences are the easiest to read and understand!





Zawjah Junaid Mukaty astounds us with some glimpses from the life of a beloved companion of Prophet , Hadhrat Miqdad bin Amar , the chosen one who had phenomenal skills and intelligence

Hadhrat Miqdad 🦀 was a tall broad man with a dark complexion who was born in Hadramout, Yemen. While he was young, he got indulged in a fight in which he injured the opponent's leg. He got frightened and left his birthplace and reached Makkah. Makkah was a city full of ignorant people who had many negative aspects in their personalities amongst which was enslaving people who had no strong support on their back. Trying to take precaution, Hadhrat Migdad made a deal with Aswad bin Qarshi Zuhri who belonged to the Zuhri tribe. This way he attained safety from anyone who would try to enslave and harm him.

Hadhrat Miqdad was very brave, a quality which was highly appreciated by the Makkans. Aswad Zuhri was so impressed by this attribute that he declared Hadhrat Miqdad as his son and his heir,

from where he got his new name: Miqdad bin Aswad Qarshi Zuhri. History remembers this courageous man by other names too like Miqdad bin Amar Kindi, bin Amar Behravi and bin Aswad Hizrami.

Hadhrat Miqdad had heard during travelling that it was about time for a messenger to arrive. He immediately reached to the decision that he will follow the Apostle and when the time came, he executed his plan by becoming the seventh Muslim.

It was not a piece of cake for him to embrace Islam. He lost his position among the Makkans and was seriously persecuted.

Migrations

The weak Muslims were an easy target for the most ignorant Kuffar

of those times. However, the light of Imaan kept on burning in the hearts of these sacred companions of Prophet . When this behaviour of Kuffar became unbearable, Hadhrat Muhammad ordered some Muslims to migrate to Abyssinia and Hadhrat Miqdad was among those 83 Muslims.

His story of second migration which was towards Madinah is also very interesting. Two hundred polytheists left for Madinah under the leadership of either Ikramah bin Abu Jahl or Abu Sufyan as spies. When the Prophet heard of this news, he sent a small group of seven to deal with them. Hadhrat Miqdad and Hadhrat Utbah bin Ghazwan hatched a plan and feigningly joined the group of Kuffar. In this skirmish, Kuffar returned back without fighting while these two, very cautiously united with the Muslim group and

reached Madinah.

Life in Madinah

When Hadhrat Miqdad reached Madinah he was destitute. Hadhrat Muhammad himself gave him protection with other two sahabah. After some time he got settled in his new life and married Hadhrat Zubair bin Abdul Muttalib's daughter, who was a cousin of the Prophet had only one daughter who was named Kareema.

In the second year of migration, Abu Sufyan was leading a caravan back from Syria which had profits of looted and stolen property of Muslims. Muslims wanted to get hold of this caravan but Abu Sufyan changed his direction. They, Hadhrat Muhammad was extremely happy with these words and this was the time when the decision of attack was taken.

In this battle there were only two horses with the Muslim army, one of the riders was Hadhrat Miqdad and the other was Hadhrat Haritha bin Surraqqa. Hadhrat Haritha got martyred leaving behind only one rider against hundreds. This daring companion of our beloved Prophet was a master in horse riding, archery and sword fight and was well known to be equal to one thousand soldiers. Hadhrat Miqdad proved himself for what he was famous for.

During the caliphate of Hadhrat Umer , Hadhrat Amr bin Aas

which had seen Prophet , I wish I could have also seen the Prophet . The reply that Hadhrat Miqdad gave to this man shows that he was a man of great intellect and deep insight. He replied that do not say so because if you would have been at that time to see him, then there were so many people who saw him and are now thrown in Jahannum. It was such a huge test at that time as we were persecuted and we were harmed. Thank Allah that you are born a Muslim and a believer. Please don't say that I wish I would have been there because you don't know which side you would have died on.

This above statement teaches us a lesson that we should be thankful we were sent on this earth to a

on the other hand, were also prepared with a large army back at home. Hadhrat Muhammad wanted to devise a planned strategy to face the storm, therefore he discussed the issue with his devoted companions.

Hadhrat Miqdad, at this troubled time, expressed his deep rooted love for Islam and its last Messenger by saying these words: "We will not tell you what people of Moosa had told him that you and your Lord go and fight, and we will sit back! But we'll tell you that you go and we will come with you. We will fight in front of you and behind you, on your right and your left. There is nothing that you will instruct us and we will not do."

who was on the battle front in Egypt asked for help. The caliph sent four thousand soldiers under four military officers including Hadhrat Miqdad saying that each officer is equal to thousand soldiers.

This lion-hearted valiant man was not only a gallant soldier but also a Hafiz e Quran and a successful businessman. He took part in many battles while he also performed Hajj with the Prophet . He was also there at the time of the Pledge of Rizwaan.

It was the period of Hadhrat Usman bin Affan when a man came and met Hadhrat Miqdad and said I would love to look at those eyes

Muslim family. We did not need to search right from wrong, we were not maltreated, we were not persecuted. We just need to polish our beliefs, we just need to come out of our comfort zones and be closer to our Almighty All-Loving Allah.

Death

Hadhrat Miqdad died at the age of seventy in 33 Hijrah. Hadhrat Usman conducted his funeral prayers and was buried in Jannat ul Baqi in Madinah.

May Allah give us strength to surrender to the instructions of Allah and his Messenger the way these chosen companions did. Ameen

Assalam-Ò-Alaikum!


I feel really sad about the tough times that you all are going through. May Allah taala ease them, we are constantly making dua for you all. May Allah take you to the highest ranks in Jannah.
