- A foam tray (like the kind meat comes in) or a piece of noncurrogated cardboard
- A tray, bowl, or cookie sheet full of water

## what to do:

Cut the foam tray or cardboard into a boat shape as shown below: A good size seems to be about 2 inches long.

Dip the toothpick into the liquid soap and use the toothpick to put soap onto the sides of the notch at the back of the boat.

That's it! Now carefully place the boat onto the surface of the water and watch it scoot across the water for several seconds - you've made a soap-powered boat! To demonstrate the boat again, you will need to rinse out the tray to remove any soap from the previous demonstration.

## How does it work?

Soap is a surfactant - that means that it breaks down the surface tension of water. As the surface tension is broken up, it creates enough of a force to push the lightweight boat across the surface.

Baitussalam is one of those institutions in Pakistan that is working tirelessly to spread a greater understanding of deen among the masses. In today's fastpaced world, Baitussalam, in its quest to helping all understand a little more about the religion we follow, has come up with an innovative solution: E-learning.

E-Baitussalam is an online platform where people from around the world, regardless of age or occupation, can come together to learn about different aspects of Al-Islam. They have a highly user-friendly website, which enables you to easily login through your email and get access to a host of different subjects being taught. The teachers are very helpful and welcoming, and even though we get students from all levels – some at an intermediate level of learning while others are at the beginning stages – the teachers are able to patiently convey the message to the entire class and with great dedication Masha'Allah.

There is also a forum where you can chat with each other (and the teacher) while listening to the lesson. We also practice on our microphones, so each student gets a chance to communicate with the teacher and learn in real-time just like in a normal classroom. Each lesson is about an hour long, which is enough to grasp the basic concepts of the subject matter taught; followed by a little homework. This assignment is then checked by the teachers too, so you know where you went wrong.

For those who are unable (for whatever reason) to come online and learn in real-time along with the rest of the class, E-Baitussalm regularly uploads recorded versions of the lesson, along with the assignments required for the next class. The students receive a notification via email about the recording once it has been uploaded onto their website, and they can then easily access it before joining the next class.

So far, E-Baitussalam has successfully undertaken several different Islamic courses, from the Arabic language, Namaz and Taharat (Cleanliness), Tafseer, life of the Prophet Muhammad and others. The web site also launched a course for teenagers, "Girls Galaxy", which aimed at showing teenage girls that Islam can be fun too! Relating to issues which the youth face and taught solely in English, this course will end on the 8th of June.

For the holy month of Ramadan, E-Baitussalam did a two-day online course on 'Meaningful Ramadan', as well as a 5-week course related to the fiqh of Ramadan and Zakah. The Dura-e-Quran is also being carried out and is ongoing until the 20th of Ramadan.

Recently, a ceremony was also held where the participants, who diligently completed the various courses, were awarded certificates.

Prophet Muhammad Said: "Seeking Knowledge is obligatory upon every Muslim." (Al-Bayhaqi & Al-Tabarani). Though this Hadith is known to most Muslims, however, the essence, the amount, and the kind of knowledge referred to in this Hadith remains misunderstood by many; for the knowledge that is incumbent upon every Muslim pertains to religious knowledge. So these online classes have made this important task of seeking religious knowledge all the simpler for those of us who can't find the time and means to leave our homes and dedicate ourselves to the Madrassah routines.

E-Baitussalam has made it possible for so many women across the globe to come together and form a sisterhood based on their love of deen. No wonder the number of enrollments reached thousand in just a matter of three months and are increasing day by day. It has provided a platform to help Muslim women realise their worth in the light of Islam, and help each and every one of us to dig a little deeper into our faith. Zawjah Junaid Mukaty mesmerises us with the life chronicles of a blessed Sahabi – Hadhrat Abu Ayub Ansari

Each heart was pounding with excitement. Each soul wanted to be the one. Each tongue was busy praying. As soon as the camel, Qaswa, came near them, their anticipation increased and when it crossed them without stopping, they became sad. After all, the people of Madinah Munawwara were receiving their beloved Prophet with open arms, each one wishing to host him.

Our Prophet (2), after bearing thirteen years of persecution and hardships finally migrated to Madinah from Makkah, where the residents of this holy city were extremely delighted to be the Ansars, the Helpers. Hadhrat Muhammad 🎡 received invitations from the whole of Madinah to come and stay at their house when Allah sorted out this problem: The Prophet 🛞 said to them, "Leave this camel of mine. It is instructed where exactly to sit." Qaswa took rounds and finally sat in front of a small two story house which belonged to Hadhrat

Abu Ayub Ansari 🧠.

Hadhrat Abu Ayub Ansari's real name was Khalid Bin Zaid who belonged to the clan of Banu Najjar. He was there in the second pledge of Uqbah which took place during the season of Hajj before the migration. He was one of the devoted companions of Hadhrat Muhammad who proved to be an extremely humble host of the beloved Prophet for a couple of months.

Hadhrat Abu Ayub Ansari (4) considered himself as the luckiest man on Earth when the camel sat in front of his house. He readily picked up the few belongings of the Prophet (4) as if he was carrying the treasures of the whole world. Out of respect, he offered Prophet (4) the top floor of his house but the Prophet preferred to stay at the bottom explaining him that there will be many visitors to meet him and it would be convenient if he occupy the ground level. Hadhrat Abu Ayub Ansari (4) obeyed the orders and went up with his family.

They took special care as not to disturb the Prophet 🎡 downstairs therefore they walked and slept on the sides, avoiding the centre of the floor. Still they could not ignore the feeling of being disrespectful towards Hadhrat Muhammad 🎡. The next morning he asked the Prophet de to move upstairs as having Muhammad 🎇 beneath them was unmannerly. The Prophet 🎡 smiled and refused his offer and sent him up again. The following day a utensil broke on the top floor letting the liquid flow down to the bottom floor as the houses were not made of concrete. With the speed of light, the couple wiped the liquid and went again to ask the Prophet 💮 to move on to the top level of the house. Finally the Prophet 💮 agreed and the floors were exchanged.

While Hadhrat Muhammad dawas residing at Hadhrat Abu Ayub's house, he bought a small piece of



land next to his house which belonged to two orphan brothers Sahal and Suhail. According to a narration, this payment of 10 Misqaal gold was also made by this lucky companion. This land was then used to build Masjid e Nabawi. Next to it were the rooms built for the Prophet and his wives thus making Abu Ayub Ansari the neighbour of the Prophet .

Both the Prophet and Abu Ayub Ansari and Abu Iation with each other. He hosted Prophet whenever he was hungry. One day Hadhrat Muhammad came along with Hadhrat Abu the food, but again it didn't get less. This way, miraculously, over hundred men ate the food which was supposed to be consumed by two.

This exceptional man respected the Prophet and his family greatly. When Hadhrat Ayesha a was accused by the hypocrites, his wife asked him if he had heard something about it. He told his wife to stay quiet and asked her, "Do you think you would do such a thing?"

She replied, "No I would never do such a thing."

Bakr (2), at his place. He immediately got the food prepared and served it to the guests. Hadhrat Muhammad (2) told him to call thirty men from Ansaar. He got a bit nervous as the food was enough only for two but for him words spoken by the Prophet (2) were supposed to be obeyed there and then. He hurriedly went and called them over. The food was served and all ate heartily but it didn't decrease, the Prophet (2) asked him to call another group, this second group also did justice with and said, "So Ayesha is better than you, she would never do such a thing." Allah liked this so much that in Surah Nur, He said, "Why did not the believers say to themselves when they heard, that we will not be able to do this ourselves so indeed Ayesha is better than us."

Hadhrat Abu Ayub Ansari had a great knowledge of Quran and Ahadith. He was a Hafiz e Quran and narrator of hundred and fifty Ahadith. He had a passion of listhere during the reign of Hadhrat Ameer Muawiyah . The Muslim army had surrounded the fort of Constantinople when Hadhrat Abu Ayub Ansari fell ill and breathed his last.
