
"Then we should follow the ex-

It was narrated that Anas 🧠 said: 'On the Day of Uhud, Abu Talhah stood before Prophet , covering him with a shield. Abu Talhah was a powerful archer who broke two or three bows that day. Whenever the Prophet raised his head to look at the people, Abu Talhah would say: O Prophet of Allah &, may my father and my mother be sacrificed for you, do not raise your head lest you be struck by an arrow shot by the enemy. My neck is before your neck.' (Bukhari and Muslim)

To love the Prophet means to obey him, to remember him, to follow him in everything, and to be proud of him as Allah is proud

Umm Muhammad's story echoes the feeling of a little child sodden with the horrors of war, injustice and terror

His tiny, bare feet were running, just like his empty eyes, wandering to find where his refugee camp was. He was carrying bread after suffering through a massive blast in the area and wanted to give it to his little sister before the chance ran out. He was only five years of age and suddenly everything had gone upside down in his life. Nothing was the same. Nothing at all.

The pain of his groaning stomach and freezing temperature was almost naught as compared to the recent pain of having seen his parents take their last breaths before his very eyes. He longed to meet them in heaven though, but he was also concerned about the many other young lives in Burma and Syria - shattered, destroyed, facing the horror of war every day.

Everywhere there were cries, racing feet, sounds of explosions and voices of kalimah. From the threat of being forced to flee from their lands to the threat of chemical attacks, they don't know what their fault really was. Someone tells the young boy, "We are Muslims. That's what our fault is."

He looked shocked as if someone had just told him that he was not a human. But soon, rather abruptly, the self-reliant lad burst out, "Then Allah will take our revenge from the unjust executioner."

He is spot on for our beloved Prophet has said:

"On the day of Judgment, injustice will be in darkness (misery)." (Bukhari and Muslim)

Injustice will be counted as multiples of transgressions on the day of Resurrection: one for disobeying Allah , another for his oppressing fellow humans, and thirdly for initiating and opening the gate of transgression and oppression for others to imitate.

Oh Allah, please save us from such transgressors who are bent upon killing all Muslims. > As the days passed, these questions diminished from my mind in my daily hectic college routine but one day (maybe Allah had decided to open my mind and eyes towards the Quran), it was the third period of chemistry when our teacher burst out into the classroom and started calling out the names of the students who had failed in the examination, held a few days ago.

I even didn't eat lunch that day, and although my mother and siblings tried to cheer me up that it wasn't a big deal, it still was a hard pill to swallow. I saw the Quran on the top rack of my bookshelf of my study room. I put the stool next to the book-shelf and managed to bring down the Quran.

I swept the dust on its cover and once more I sat on the couch. I had forgotten where I left reading it last time but thanks to the bookmark, it never forgets. I opened the page which was bookmarked by me the last time. I got extremely surprised at what I saw. It was the same ayah, which I had stumbled upon last time.

Then I remembered that I stopped reading Quran at exactly that ayah. A flashback came to my mind and I remembered how my teacher humiliated me in front of the whole class not bothering how much effort I had put into my test. It was never my deliberate mistake. I had put in my efforts wholeheartedly to prepare for the examination. But like all examinations, they just want to see a good result, not caring for your efforts. But it was surprising what Allah says in the Quran. He says that he will value our efforts. He will value the thing which is hidden from the worldly folks. Subhan'Allah!

O, Allah! How great you are. Indeed you are the only one who can approach our hearts. Indeed, you are the One

Making invisible ink is a lot of fun, you can pretend you are a secret agent as you keep all your secret codes and messages hidden from others. All you need is some basic household objects and the hidden power of lemon juice.

What you'll need:

- Half a lemon
- Water
- Spoon
- Bowl
- Cotton bud
- White paper
- Lamp or other light bulb




Instructions:

- Squeeze some lemon juice into the bowl and add a few drops of water.
- Mix the water and lemon juice with the spoon.
- Dip the cotton bud into the mixture and write a message onto the white
- Wait for the juice to dry so it becomes completely invisible.
- When you are ready to read your secret message or show it to someone else, heat the paper by holding it close to a light bulb.

What's happening?

Lemon juice is an organic substance that oxidizes and turns brown when heated. Diluting the lemon juice in water makes it very hard to notice when you apply it the paper, no one will be aware of its presence until it is heated and the secret message is revealed. Other substances which work in the same way include orange juice, honey, milk, onion juice, vinegar and wine. Invisible ink can also be made using chemical reactions or by viewing certain liquids under ultraviolet (UV) light.






I thought twice over why I gave the money to Mangoo if this is what he did with it. The next day as I left my house, I found Mangoo standing at the corner with his one eye.

When ring disturbs the peace and beds creak When the call to success echoes, arising people


When time's running out and the sun's reaching its peak

On his way back he met a slave girl of Abdullah bin Jidaan who told him that Abu Jahl had attacked and abused Prophet Muhammad 🎡 in public. Though he himself was not a Muslim yet but he knew his nephew's character and his love for the Prophet Muhammad @ was immense.

He got enraged and first went to the Prophet to confirm the news. His affirmation was the last nail in the coffin. Hadhrat Hamza & vouched towards Abu Jahl who was sitting proudly with many people of his tribe and struck him with a bow that cut open his head. Then came Hadhrat Hamza's words which surprised and frightened many over there...

He said, "Will you insult him when I am of his religion and say what he says? Hit me if you can." No one dared to come and stop him and then this robust man, Hadhrat Hamza , went away confidently to Dar-e-Argam to turn his words into a reality.

Dar-e-Argam was a secret hideout of Muslims. After he accepted Islam he started guarding the door of this hideout. When Hadhrat Umer came to Dar-e-Argam he prayed to Allah & that if goodness was intended by him, let him accept Islam and if he intended anything else, make it easy for them to overcome him. On the way home his father asked



Hajj is one of the five pillars of Islam. It is compulsory for every men to perform Hajj once in his life. Hajj is the pilgrimage to the holy city of Makkah. Hajj occurs every year during the month of ZilHajj, the last month in the Islamic calendar.

Hajj is only obligatory on those who can afford it. Every pilgrim wears an Ihram, which consists of two white sheets. Ihram shows simplicity and equality among pilgrims and also reminds them of death as when

one dies he is covered in a white cloth just like Ihram.

This is the day on which both the poor and rich walk together around the Kaaba, maintaining equality in their similar clothes. When a pilgrim is in the condition of Ihram and has done the Niyyah then he cannot wear perfume. Other than that he cannot cut nails and hair. If a person by mistake cuts his nail or hair or he wears perfume he will have to give a penalty which is called Dum (sacrificing an animal within the boundary of Makkah). During Ihram men should not cover their face, hands or feet.

Allah & loves the pilgrim when they come for Hajj dressed simply. They are even sweating badly but still they go on in the way of Allah under the scorching heat of the sun. They do so to make Allah happy. It is said that if a pilgrim performs Hajj keeping all the obligations in mind then that person would just be like a new born baby
